We are still in the process of finalizing staff for the Pro Shop. It has been a struggle to find applicants for our Pro Shop positions but should have some interviews set up shortly. Our hope is to have our staff set up for training so that we can open the Clubhouse starting May 21st for golfers to come in and pay their memberships. This date is tentative and subject to change. Again, the date for when the course will be open for play is still to be determined. We currently do not have anyone to run the Kitchen for the upcoming golf season. In the past, we were required to provide food as a requirement for our Liquor Licence. This law has changed where we no longer have this requirement. However, the Board is exploring options for providing some kind of food to our patrons similar to the past two seasons. More details should be available by the time we open for the season.

It seems that we may have someone to run some semblance of a Men's Night for the upcoming golf season. What that will look like and when it will start are yet to be determined.

With the various challenges we have faced over the past several years, in addition to the challenges the Board has faced in getting the course staffed and up and running for this season, it is important that all our members and patrons work with the Board to help keep the course viable for the long term. While we are thankful to have continued financial support from the Municipality, it is actually the support from all our golfers that keeps the Kenogamisis Golf Club operational. With a potential expected influx of workers for the mine, the hope is for increased golf play for this season. Our hope is for all of you to have an enjoyable golf season as we come out of the past two seasons of Covid regulated play.
